Charis Doris-Amy Wilder is the reigning 2012 "Miss Black Alabama". She was crowned on Sunday, November 6th 2011 at the Alabama Jazz Hall Carver Theatre in Birmingham, Alabama. She is a 2009 graduate of the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa where she received a bachelor's degree in Health Care Management. She serves as the Office Manager at Women's Health Associates in Birmingham, Alabama. Charis is currently working towards an MBA in Health Administration at The University of Alabama in Birmingham. Her platform seeks to eliminate preventable birth defects in babies by educating mothers on the importance of receiving adequate prenatal care. She demonstrates her pageant platform by educating teens and women the essentials of living healthy lifestyles.

Charis is a member of the Historic Bethel Baptist Church in Collegeville, where her father serves as the senior Pastor. Her morals and values were shaped by several prominent and influential people in the state of Alabama; among them was the late Reverend Fred Shuttlesworth, the former pastor of her father's church. As a child attending church, she heard the stories, saw the scars, and witnessed the testimonies of the struggle that helped propel her where she is today. The stories of undying courage and determination have given her the encouragement to continue striving to empower others no matter their status, color, or ethnicity.

Charis is no stranger to serving others. She balances her time as a member of the youth and progressive choir, drama ministry, singles ministry, children's church teacher and Sunday school teacher. Along with another church member, she organized and began Girl Scouts troop #30412 in the Collegeville area. Charis and her mother, Mechelle, also co-founded the Bethel Baptist Church Fine Arts Academy where they are instructing students to play the piano.

While attending the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Charis was a 4-year member of the Million Dollar Band. She served as the flute section leader for two of her four years in the band. She was the Chaplin of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Incorporated, President of the International Business Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi for two years, and was regularly recognized for her academic achievements. She volunteered her time as an animal shelter worker, sister-to-sister mentor, Junior Achievement teacher, and Save First certified tax assistant. She was selected as a member of the 2006 Avanti Leadership Team. Recently she was recognized as the District Director of the Year for the Central Gulf Region for her leadership of the Alpha Sigma Chapter of Delta Sigma Pi.

Charis is a 2005 graduate of Spain Park High School where she played girls basketball, served as the school's first drum major for 3 years, was selected as a school ambassador, a member of the show choir, and was voted the most musical female senior for her graduating class.

Music has always been a part of Charis' life. She has studied the flute since the 5th grade and has performed in numerous weddings, concerts, and recitals. She finds comfort and strength in her music as it has always been one way to express her gratitude for the gift of life.

Charis looks forward to her reign as Miss Black Alabama 2012. She views it as an opportunity to expand her horizons and contribute to the betterment of society. During her reign, she plans to do various speaking engagements and appearances in which she hopes to educate youth and women about various birth defects. Jesse Matthews Named to NLC Board



Councilmember Jesse Matthews of Bessemer was elected to serve a one year unexpired term on the National League of Cities' (NLC) Board of Directors during the annual NLC business session on Saturday, November 12 at the Congress of Cities in Phoenix, Arizona. Matthews was first elected to the Bessemer City Council in 1998 and has also served as Council President. During his tenure, he has initiated and supported the creation of McNeil Park, worked closely on the Sanitary Sewer Project for the Pipe Shop Community, installed several new stop signs and lights and eliminated overgrown lots in District 6 communities. He has served on the Alabama League of Municipalities' Executive Board since 2004 and is an Advanced Certified Municipal Official. Matthews is a member of the Bessemer Chamber of Commerce, the Bessemer Fourth of July Committee, the Jesus Christian Daycare and School Board, the Israel Williams Scholarship Fund Board, the Jefferson Democratic Conference Committee and the Alabama Democratic Conference Committee. He is the Second Vice President of the Alabama Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials and serves on the Deacon Board Ministry and as a youth advisor for the New Bethlehem Baptist Church. NLC is governed by a Board of Directors which is made up of the three officers -- president, first vice president, second vice president -- and 40 members. To serve as a member of the NLC Board of

Directors, a candidate must be a local elected official from a member city, or a chief executive officer of a member league. An elected official serving as an Officer or Board member must remain a local elected official throughout his/her Board term. After completion of their terms, members of the Board of Directors still in government service become members of the Advisory Council. Former Board members continue to serve on the Advisory Council as long as they are in government service. The Alabama League currently has three representatives serving on the NLC Advisory Council: Mayor Leon Smith of Oxford, Mayor Ted Jennings of Brewton and Councilmember Debbie Quinn of Fairhope, who is the current chairperson of the Advisory Council.


