### **Aerotec Holds Open House and Ribbon Cutting**

The Chamber's newest member James Dow and his staff welcomed a large crowd of well wishers to the Aerotec Open House on June 12<sup>th</sup>. Dow is the founder and CEO of Aerotec\_a high-tech firm located at the Bessemer Airport. "We're a small, little company, and we have lots of fun here every day because we do lots of different things,"

The firm uses advanced airborne remote sensing, data capture and data analysis to provide incredibly detailed topographic maps and models to its customers throughout North America. Attendees at the event Wednesday included Mayor Kenneth Gulley and other Bessemer city officials, city council members, Chamber staff and Ambassadors, local businesses, and Aerotec employees.

"We just joined the Chamber of Commerce," Dow told a reporter after the event. "We were so small, and most of our clients were out of state, so we never joined prior to this." Bessemer helped Aerotec. Dow said, "For one thing, we didn't have any money, and the Bessemer (Industrial) Development Board decided to build this office and hangar for us." Dow said that he was encouraged to join the Chamber recently by Nikki Jordan, the chairman of the board of the Bessemer Airport Authority and Chamber Ambassador. Nikki said joining the Chamber can really help a company's marketing efforts because of the networking opportunities. She said events like the ribbon cutting and open house were good for the business and the airport.






