# Purpose of Pride Program

The Chamber is encouraging its members to take PRIDE in their own facilities and help in the area where they are located and then volunteer during the campaign to make Bessemer cleaner. City Councilman Chester Porter from District 2 who also serves on the PRIDE committee, has jumped on the cleanup of his district with clean up days and encouraging his district to take PRIDE in their neighborhoods. Sarah Belcher, City Councilperson for District 3, has worked over the last several years on projects at Hard Elementary School, Bessemer Housing Authority, and getting the drainage ditches cleared in her neighborhoods. Cleo King (District 7) and Donna Thigpen (District 4), Council members, have worked hard to get their districts to buy into the PRIDE Program. Councilmen Ron Marshall (District 5), Jesse Matthews (District 6) and David Vance (District 1) all support the Take PRIDE in Bessemer campaign and urge their districts to work hard to show their PRIDE.

The PRIDE Program was begun by the Chamber in 1998. It first focused on the business community with quarterly awards for the business showing PRIDE in their facility. The program was expanded in 2004 with the Day of Service begun by the Chamber, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and The Foundry. This was quickly expanded to the Week of Service so other faith based and civic groups could participate. Some projects of note from the past are the James A. Davis Middle School clean up, Hard Elementary School project, McAdory Elementary school project by Vulcan Materials, and the Bessemer Hall of History.




## **City Pledge**


