





Seven individuals preside over Bessemer's districts with the goal the city councilors who govern them, and a few of the prominent to nourish their communities while empowering the citizens of aspects that ultimately come together to truly make Bessemer a those communities. The Bessemer City Council works diligently marvelous city! alongside the mayor to ensure that the city continues to move in

a positive direction. Bessemer has grown tremendously over the last several years, with each district experiencing its own distinctive growth and development. Here's a glimpse inside these districts,

## JARVIS COLLIER

DISTRICT 1

#### TELL ME ABOUT YOURSELF, YOUR TIES HISTORY TO BESSEMER, AND HOW YOU CAME TO HOLD THE POSITION AS CITY COUNCILOR OF YOUR DISTRICT.

I am a leader, motivator, and the voice for the people in the community. I am married to Jocelyn Collier, and we have four children and one grandchild. I grew up in Bessemer, AL, and I started my business here over 21 years ago. I am the owner of Collier's Barber & Style and founder of Collier's Barbering Institute, both located right



here in the Marvel City. I am a deacon and member of First Baptist Church Old Jonesboro. My belief in family and my community led me to run for office. I had an abundance of support not only being from this district, but by knowing a lot of the residents personally. It felt like it was the right place to be. I hit the streets of District 1 knocking door to door, my dedicated team made phone calls and together we campaigned. With many prayers and support of the community, I became Councilman Jarvis Collier.



#### How has your district grown or IMPROVED SINCE YOU TOOK OFFICE?

District 1 has improved mainly because I am attentive. I pride myself on riding through the community, listening to the citizens and noting what their needs are. I work closely with the Street and Sanitation Department to ensure that the needs of the residents are met, and items picked up timely. I have great participation with quarterly clean ups; this also ensures the entire community stays clean. I have also had the opportunity to partner with other nonprofit organizations to assist with building accessible ramps to some of the citizens in my district.

#### WHAT ARE SOME OF THE PROMINENT THINGS IN OR ABOUT YOUR DISTRICT THAT YOU ARE THE PROUDEST OF?

I am most proud of my district because of the history that surrounds it. District 1 has one of the oldest standing communities in Jefferson County, which is the Jonesboro Community. Located in the heart of central Alabama, Bessemer is home to almost 27,000 residents. Founded in 1887 by Henry DeBardeleben, Bessemer grew rapidly earning its nickname "The Marvel City". District 1 is the historical landmark of DeBardeleben Park, named after the city's founder. It is currently used for family picnics, walks, and entertainment gatherings.

As a young boy, I would pass this bright star on the front of the restaurant whenever my grandmother would go into town. It was not until I became councilman that I learned the history of "The Bright Star".

It is with great honor that I am to speak about one of the most influential people that made a positive impact on District 1. It is a privilege to have personally known one of our former mayors, Mayor Quitman Mitchell. Mayor Mitchell reminds me a lot of myself: his love for God, family, community, and the art of barbering. As a child, Mayor Mitchell believed in becoming a barber, and he would watch his father for long hours day after day cutting hair. He would go on to become a licensed barber and was the first African American voted

on the Jefferson County Barber Commission. Mayor Mitchell once worked at and later became the owner of 20th Century Barbershop in Bessemer, AL. He had an outstanding career for over 34 years before he became the mayor of Bessemer in 1990.

#### WHAT FUTURE PLANS DO YOU HAVE FOR YOUR DISTRICT?

My future plans for District 1 consist of continuing to work with the mayor and the other councilors for better infrastructure. The city of Bessemer is moving forward and with economic development, an increase of public safety and the expansion of community engagement we should begin to see less crime and more community growth. One of my main focal points for the new year is to revitalize downtown. We can give downtown an uptown vibe by investing into the area, generating more businesses, and providing more opportunities for business owners. •



#### HISTORY TO BESSEMER, AND HOW YOU CAME TO HOLD THE POSITION AS CITY COUNCILOR OF YOUR DISTRICT.

I've been in Bessemer all of my life; my family is here in Bessemer. I attend New Jerusalem Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Reginald Calvert. I am a mother of one son that attends Alabama State University. Being a nurse for 14 years and traveling the world,



you see a lot of things. You also see a lot of communities change, and you want to see that for your own community. I've always been involved in politics all my life; my mom is Alabama State Representative Louise Alexander. Helping people and being an advocate for people has always been a passion of mine. When it was time to run for the city council seat, I decided to give it a try to see if I could make a difference.

#### Tell me about yourself, your ties/ How has your district grown or IMPROVED SINCE YOU TOOK OFFICE?

Since taking office, we have torn down several dilapidated houses; I think my district has the most houses of all 7 districts to be torn down. We have new gas lines, new sidewalks, several small businesses that have opened, and food pantries that really helped our citizens receive fresh fruits, vegetables, and hot meals during the Covid-19 pandemic. When Covid-19 hit, it slowed a lot of the plans and progress down in my district.

#### What future plans do you have FOR YOUR DISTRICT?

We will be building back more homes because we want more home ownership and working closely with the board of education for the children in the school system. We also plan to organize a cleanup and cutting crew for the elderly in the district and partner with non-profits



to open more food pantries throughout the city. We're going to continue to work with the churches and the pastors throughout the district, as well as partnering with organizations to restore historical landmarks that are vital to maintaining the history of our Marvel City. •

#### TELL ME ABOUT YOURSELF, YOUR TIES/ HISTORY TO BESSEMER, AND HOW YOU CAME TO HOLD THE POSITION AS CITY COUNCILOR OF YOUR DISTRICT.

I am the mother of three beautiful children and grandmother to ten grandchildren. I was educated in the Bessemer City school system and studied at both Miles College and Birmingham Easonian Baptist Bible college. I'm a member of the National League of Cities Board of Directors, the Alabama League of Municipalities HD



Committee, and the National Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials (NBC-LEO). I was born and reared in District 3, and there was a need for change! With the previous councilor retiring, the time had come for me to be the voice of the change that I wanted to see. I campaigned and was elected by the citizens in District 3. I currently serve as Bessemer City Council President and have done so since 2019.

## Tell me about yourself, your ties/ How has your district grown or history to Bessemer, and how improved since you took office?

We have increased businesses within the district and worked to make the former Charles F. Hard Park family friendly by changing the name to include the citizens, the Southside Community Park. We added a water fountain, sitting areas, a pavilion and upgraded the lighting. We have also hosted numerous events and activities in the community such as the annual "Back to School, School Supply" rallies, egg hunts and "trunk



o' treat", and an annual "Health Walk". We've partnered with Charles F. Hard Elementary School to purchase an electronic sign board and with a local church to start the first ever warming station in the city of Bessemer for the homeless and less fortunate. We've also started the "Living Legend Luncheon (LLL)" to honor local unsung heroes.



## WHAT ARE SOME PROMINENT REASONS YOU ARE PROUD OF YOUR DISTRICT?

The historical background in iron ore (The Sloss Mine) and the public-private partnership with local businesses are what I'm most proud of.

## WHAT FUTURE PLANS DO YOU HAVE FOR YOUR DISTRICT?

My wish list and future plans for District 3 include upgrading infrastructure, mainly water lines, and improving lighting and paving in the middle-class subdivisions.



I would like more public and private partnerships with incoming businesses creating revenue for the city of Bessemer. Other plans include a strip mall with a supermarket, a storm shelter, a water park for the children, and a senior citizen's center with meeting rooms and city-wide broadband to generate revenue. •

#### Tell me about yourself, your ties/ How has your district grown or HISTORY TO BESSEMER, AND HOW YOU CAME TO HOLD THE POSITION AS CITY COUNCILOR OF YOUR DISTRICT.

I was reared in Roosevelt City and attended Roosevelt Elementary School. I am a graduate of Wenonah High School. I also earned a B.A. Degree from the University of Alabama- Tuscaloosa Campus. My professional careers were in the banking and telecommunications industry. I am currently the co-owner of Myriad Communications Network, Inc. where we produce the Myriad Gospel Music



Countdown; a program heard on over 50 radio stations across the country. Locally, I am the host of the Ron Marshall Praise Experience heard every Sunday Morning from 6am-10am on V-949 and WATV. My ties to Bessemer are from a time when Bessemer had a booming downtown with a variety of department stores. My college degree encompassed quite a bit of Political Science courses; thus, I gained an interest in politics and decided to enter the arena with a notion to use my managerial and interpersonal skills to strive to help Bessemer to grow and to prosper.

## IMPROVED SINCE YOU TOOK OFFICE?

With the cooperation of the mayor, council members and employees of the City, I have seen dilapidated structures torn down, some streets paved, roofs replaced on the homes of several senior citizens, several handicap ramps, mechanical indoor ramp, and heating/cooling units. As the councilor for District 5, I am committed to spending time in the district to interact with residents and business owners to listen and address their concerns as well as to make them aware of available city programs.

#### WHAT ARE SOME PROMINENT REASONS YOU ARE PROUD OF YOUR DISTRICT?

I am proud to have UAB Medical West in District 5 as well as Lawson State Community College. I am also proud of Westhills Elementary School and Bessemer City Middle School. We also have a number



of churches and pastors who are supportive of the district. I cannot fail to mention a number of citizens who are concerned about the overall condition of the district and who will call upon me to make

me aware of issues that need to be ad dressed. Even though I survey the dis trict on a regular basis and report to the appropriate department the issues that need to be addressed, I depend on the help and support of citizens and busi ness owners to make this district better. 

#### WHAT ARE SOME PROMINENT REASONS YOU ARE PROUD OF YOUR DISTRICT?

· Alabama Splash Adventure which was originally known as VisionLand, Alabama Adventure and Splash Adventure is a water park/ amusement park that is located off of Interstate 20/59 in Bessemer, Alabama The park was a team effort of eleven cities that came together and formed the West Jefferson Amusement and Public Park Authority. Currently, the park is operated by the Koch Family Parks and offers a safe, family fun environment. They have added to the many existing attractions a kids roller coaster, a train, two boat rides, mini helicopters, and a laser maze. In 2015 Rampage, the park's signature wooden roller coaster, reopened after a complete restoration. In 2021, Alabama Splash Adventure announced a new Rocket Racer, a new six-lane water slide, which stands more than 50 feet tall and represents their largest waterpark expansion to date. Alabama Splash Adventure employs seasonal part-time and full-time employees which adds a boost to the local economy. (BHAM WIKI, 2018)

• In June 2018, the Seattle, Washington-based internet retail giant confirmed plans for an 825,000-square-foot fulfillment center in Bessemer, just minutes away from downtown Birmingham. Total investment from Amazon and its partners in the project is \$325 million. The center has brought approximately 1,500 full-time jobs. The 1,500 full-time employees will work alongside Amazon's advanced robotics technology. The Amazon Fulfillment Center is projected to deliver a significant economic impact for Jefferson County and



Alabama. For starters, the annual payroll at the high-tech facility will top \$46 million. Overall, the center will contribute \$203 million to the county's economic output annually, while adding \$123 million to the county's GDP, according to a study prepared by the Center for Business and Economic Research in the University of Alabama's Culverhouse School of Business. Amazon is seen as a powerful catalyst for growth in Bessemer, a former industrial center that was once home to large steelmaking operations. In fact, U.S. Steel previously owned the land where the facility is being built. (How Amazon Picked the Prime Site for Its First Alabama Fulfillment Center, n.d.)

· Promenade Tannehill (formerly Colonial Promenade Tannehill) is located at the intersection of Eastern Valley Road and Pocahontas Road that is easily seen from I-459 in Bessemer. The shopping center officially opened in July of 2008. The approximately \$75 million, 347,151-square-foot shopping center was developed by Colonial Properties Trust. The shopping center was sold to Dallas, Texas-based Cypress Equities in September 2013. (BHAM WIKI, 2021)

The future in the city of Bessemer continues to look bright in spite of a worldwide pandemic.

Consider these positive developments in 2021 when discussing Bessemer's future:

#### **JOB GROWTH**

Bessemer continues to experience rapid industrial and economic expansion. Some 1,000 new jobs are expected in the Marvel City over the next few years thanks to companies such as Carvana, Lowe's, FedEx, and Amazon expanding operations into Bessemer. Carvana opened the doors on its \$40 million


facility in the first quarter of 2021. Amazon, Lowe's, and FedEx all had facilities under construction in the third quarter of 2021. TSF Sportswear broke ground in that same quarter on a new facility in the city on Turin Drive. "The business-friendly climate in this city has propelled us forward," said Bessemer Mayor Kenneth Gulley. "We have emerged in Jefferson County as a can-do, blue-collar city. "Many of these new jobs are promising starting wages - and I want to emphasize starting wages - of \$15 an hour. This will help us lift the standard of living in Bessemer."

#### HOUSING

As expected, the influx of industry and jobs has sparked a demand for new housing in Bessemer. Several developers have either announced or submitted plans to build new housing in the city. Habitat for Humanity of Greater Birmingham announced that it plans to build 125 new garden and patio homes along Hopewell Road. The homes will be part of a mixed-income community by Habitat. Some homes will be in Bessemer and others in unincorporated Jefferson County. "With all the development in that area, there's a need for housing," Patricia Burch, Executive Director for Habitat, told FOX6 News.

#### **DOWNTOWN REDEVELOPMENT**

With job growth and housing demand rising, interest in Downtown Bessemer is rebounding. Milwaukee-based developer Scott Crawford, Inc. and partner Cardinal Capital purchased the former Bessemer City Hall in March 2021 and announced plans to convert it into a mixed-use development with 40 to 50 market rate rental units and ground floor commercial space. STRADA Professional Services LLC began work on an Opportunity Zone Prospectus for the city to attract more development in the downtown corridor. An Opportunity Zone is defined as a new alternative economic development program established by Congress in the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017. The program is meant to foster private-sector investments in low-income rural and urban areas. Downtown Bessemer, portions of the Westlake community, and of the old Jonesboro community are part of the Opportunity Zone.



in 2021 to help propel redevelopment in Downtown and explore creation of historic neighborhoods in other parts of the city. With annual events such as the Bob Sykes BBQ and Blues Festival and the Central Alabama Caribbean Festival scheduled to return to Debardeleben Park in spring 2022, Downtown Bessemer is poised to be a focal point of the city's future and that of western Jefferson County.

#### RECREATION AND QUALITY OF LIFE

The city plans to open the second and third phases of its Rail-Trail in 2021. Plans include expanding the trail into downtown Bessemer in future phases. The city has secured grant funding to connect the Rail-Trail to the Recreation Center via a pedestrian bridge across 14th Street, or Highway 150. The Bessemer Recreation Center, opened in 2016, boasts a membership of more than 10,000 strong and celebrated



its fifth anniversary in 2021. Two new hotels are being constructed in the Academy Drive area, just in time for the advent of the World Games in neighboring Birmingham in 2022 and a future football slate

for the University of Alabama which will include home games with college football blue bloods such as Texas, Wisconsin, and Notre Dame.

Starbucks began construction on a free-standing shop on Academy Drive in the third quarter of 2021. Two new seafood restaurants also opened in the Academy Drive area in 2021. Mayor Gulley said Bessemer's momentum can be attributed to the hard work and dedication of



many in the community. The pandemic and uncertain times have not hindered the city's trajectory, the Mayor said. "One thing I am certain of is that Bessemer, Alabama has positioned itself to be at the forefront of this region in the 21st Century," the Mayor said. "This has been due to the hard work of my office, the city council, many of our business leaders and countless others who I do not have the time to name.

"Our best days remain ahead of us." •

   Office of Civil Rights, Accreditation Review, Compliance Monitoring Review, Financial Audit, and many others. Bessemer City Schools received stellar ratings on all.
- Mission #ReImagineBessemerCitySchools. This initiative aims to change the trajectory of how we internally and externally view Bessemer City Schools. We are mastering this goal through business partnerships, community non-profit-based organizations partnerships, various exposure opportunities for students (i.e., college visits, career fairs, mental health seminars), and numerous other innovative implementations we have added in the last two years.
- Amazon Future Engineers Program with Bessemer City Schools.
   This program offers possible paid career and college opportunities for our students through Amazon, Bessemer campus.
- Ensure that all students are provided with a Chromebook laptop device for instructional use while at school and at home. The school system also purchased mobile wifi hotspot devices for families in need.
- We staffed two mental health counselors and two social workers to provide services and resources for our students and families in need of various social and emotional services and resources. As well as additional fine arts teachers.





- We incorporated our monthly Employee of the Month program, P.R.I.D.E., where all staff members have the opportunity to nominate and vote on the employee that will represent the district for their dedication, innovation and stellar performance in their roles. This recognition has evolved into a partnership with America's First Credit Union, where they provide a special token to those individuals each month.
- Many other programs, initiatives, and efforts to show appreciation to our staff for their dedication to our school system during these challenging times.



As the Bessemer Area Chamber of Commerce celebrates our 100th anniversary, we cannot overlook the other wonderful businesses in the city who have also stood the test of time and reached the momentous achievement of 100 years in business!

#### Bessemer Coal, Iron, and Land Company

The name "Town Company" was appropriately used to describe the Bessemer Land and Improvement Company. Its promotional activities made it the guiding influence in early Bessemer history. Henry F. DeBardeleben and associates had built two furnaces in the area which he called Bessemer. Both were blown in the year 1888. In addition to these two were two at Robertstown, both put into operation



in 1890 and one, the little Bell furnace in Bessemer, which was also blown in the 1890. Coal from DeBardeleben's Blue Creek Mine was coked in the company's two hundred and seventy-five beehive ovens. On January 7, 1887, the Bessemer Land and Improvement Company held its first stockholder's meeting. April 2, 1890, Henry DeBardeleben assumed the presidency of the company for the second time.

#### **Bessemer Public Library**

The formation of a free public library was first organized in Dec. 1905 by a group of women who secured the donation of the site from Bessemer Coal and Land Company. They then lobbied for assistance from the city in seeking a grant from the Carnegie Foundation. It was established by a resolution of the Bessemer City Council as Bessemer Carnegie Library and opened its doors in September 1907 at 321 North 18th Street, a small brick structure at the corner of 18th Street and 4th Avenue. The City of Bessemer was given the Old Post Office building at 400 North 19th Street to use for the public library in 1965. After remodeling it in 1967, the library was renamed the Bessemer Public Library. The previous library charged a fee for removing materials. The pay library donated its 500 volumes to the new library when it opened.

In April 2000, the residents of the City of Bessemer passed an advalor tax referendum to fund the building of a new library. The library underwent a \$4.5 million expansion from 15,600 to 43,200 square feet. The Library was temporarily moved to 701 9th Avenue North in August 2001. It was in August 2008 that the library was able to return to its new state of the art, three-tier facility. A board of five trustees governs the Library. The Bessemer City Council appoints the trustees for four-terms. The terms should overlap so that at least one trustee is appointed or re-appointed each year. The regular meeting date for the Board is the third Thursday of each month. The Board conducts at least 6 meetings a year with a quorum of 3 or more trustees present. All meetings are open to the public.

#### The Bright Star

In 1907, a small cafe with only a horseshoe-shaped bar opened its doors to the bustling community of Bessemer, Alabama. Outgrowing three locations, the Bright Star moved to its present site in 1914, and patrons were introduced to a new dining atmosphere. Ceiling fans,



tile floors, mirrored and marbled walls - most of which exist today reflect the style of that era. Murals painted by an itinerant European artist are another interesting feature of the past. Major alterations and renovations of the premises and kitchen were completed in 1966, and

the dining room was expanded in 1978 with the addition of the "1907" room. Because of its growing popularity as well as the need for additional banquet space the final expansion of the Bright Star occurred in 1985 with the addition of the "Dixie" and the "Green" rooms.

The Bright Star's reputation has thrived because of special attention to two areas integral to the success of any restaurant - out

standing service and superior cuisine. Outstanding service is reflected in the consistent hard work of the two owners of the restaurant, Jim and Nick Koikos. On any given day, one or both of the owners will be on the premises overseeing the lunch and dinner shifts. Their hard work

and consistency, along with the leadership of Chef Ross Daidone, is reflected in the 90 member staff, whose average length of service exceeds 7 years. The Bright Star's dedication to superior cuisine is reflected in its commitment to use only the finest ingredients for each dish. Fresh sea

> food transported from the Gulf coast daily, the finest steaks available, and fresh vegetables and produce are customary on the luncheon and a la carte menus. Broiled Greek-style Snapper, Beef Tenderloin-Greek Style, and Broiled Chicken Greek Style are specialties of the House. Other signature dishes include combination Seafood Gumbo, Lobster and Crabmeat Au-Gratin, and the Broiled Seafood Platter.

For over 114 years, The Bright Star has entertained guests from throughout the Southeast. In 2011, The Bright Star received an award as an American Classic from The James Beard Society. In addition, CNN.com recognized The Bright Star as one of the best historic



restaurants in the United States. The Bright Star made MSN's list as one of America's 60 top Iconic Restaurants. The Bright Star has also been recognized as having the best Steak in Alabama by the Alabama Cattlemen's Association. These awards could not have been achieved without the hard work of our staff and the loyalty of our guests.

In 2019, Jimmy Koikos, an owner of the restaurant since 1968 passed away at the age of 82. His presence at the front door is sorely missed. The Bright Star's tradition of memorable meals is carried on by Jimmy's brother, Nick Koikos, Cousin Andreas Anastassakis, niece Stacey Cocoris Craig, GM Brett Collins and Operations Manager Sonya Twitty and all the staff of the restaurant. They look forward to hosting you soon.

#### City of Bessemer

In 1886 iron and steel magnate Henry Fairfield DeBardeleben founded the City of Bessemer. DeBardeleben's dream was to make the City a steel center that would attract companies and people from

all over the United States. He founded the Bessemer Land and Improvement Company to facilitate his vision. With \$2 million in starting capital, he built several blast furnaces for his Coal and Iron Company. In 1887 DeBardeleben bought 4,000 acres of land and marked off blocks for a new town along the rail lines of the Alabama Great Southern Railway. Henry

DeBardeleben believed that the town's name should reflect an economy that was built on the iron ore and steel industry. He named the community "Bessemer" in honor of Sir Henry Bessemer who invented the open-hearth method of steel producing. In April of 1887 the first commercial lots were sold, and the town of Bessemer began to grow.

The dream of Henry DeBardeleben began to take shape and the town experienced a boomtown effect. Within only a few months the city's population reached a total of 1,000 citizens. In less than two years the population soared to 4,000. The cities growth was so phenomenal that it was nicknamed the "Marvel City". The 1880 census ranked Bessemer's population as the eighth largest in the state. It was predicted that the city would become the fourth highest by the 1990 census. In fact, the city did reach the fourth largest mark long before the predicted date and it stayed there for quite some time. By June of 1887 the town of Bessemer saw the need for an established court. The first meeting of this court was held the last week of June with Justices McAdory and Jones presiding. The town also saw the need for a jail and, at the insistence of W.D. Mills, a framed building near the Rolling Mill was rented for this purpose. Due to the unsecured nature of building (with its single plank floors) a new building was rented at a cost of \$360 a year.

The town of Bessemer also began to see an increase of its middle class families. These families produced the first political leaders of the town. R.M. McAdory was elected as mayor of Bessemer and eight councilmen were elected to assist him. These men voted to incorporate the City of Bessemer on September 9, 1887. The town of Bessemer had become a city. The city elected D.B. Stapp as its first town marshal by a vote of the town council during the city's first council meeting on September 13th of that same year. At the next council meeting three men were elected as policemen at a pay of \$50 per month. One of the first duties of the town marshal and his men was the inspection of privies once a week.

> On April 17, 1889, the city council approved the city seal and an ordinance authorizing the sale of city bonds. The funds obtained through this sale allowed Bessemer to build its first city hall. The new building would include city offices, a courtroom, the city jail, the engine house for the soon to be created fire department, and a few markets. The building was

designed by the famed architect G. M. Torgenson and was to cost about \$16,000.00. The building, although incomplete, was dedicated on August 1, 1889. The building of a new center for a fire department meant that the city now needed to invest in fire equipment and an organized fire brigade. Citizens had been asking for better fire protection and they received it. Many men volunteered for the new fire department and on December 16, 1888, it received its first call. Ironically the city hall building that housed the fire department was destroyed by fire many years later. The present city hall facilities stand in its location.

This rapid growth inspired DeBardeleben into searching out new ways to hasten the community's growth. He purchased buildings that were used in the 1884 Cotton Exposition in New Orleans and had them shipped to Bessemer by rail. One of the structures, a three-story Victo-





rian building, named the Montezuma building and had been Mexico's exhibit in the fair, served as not only a hotel in Bessemer but also later as Montezuma University as well until it was later destroyed by fire. Montezuma University boasted the Birmingham area's first medical school. The Jamaica building was used as a part of the rolling mills. The social, cultural, and academic life of Bessemer flourished during its formative years. Schools, churches and civic organizations emerged with the population increase. A new library was constructed with funds from the famed industrialist Andrew Carnegie. Music and theater groups held regular performances from Birmingham while musicians like W. C. Handy, the "Memphis Blues" composer who worked at the U.S. Pipe Bessemer foundry early in his career, entertained with brass band sounds.

In 1898 City Attorney J. K. Trotter proposed the founding of a court of Inferior Jurisdiction in the city of Bessemer with jurisdiction

similar to the Inferior Court in Birmingham. It took a while for this petition to come to fruition but in 1915 the City of Bessemer saw the construction of a county courthouse situated directly across from the City Hall. Bessemer now had the court facilities for all of the needs of the Bessemer Cut-off area.

based economy attracted a great number of laborers to the city and by the 1920s Bessemer was the fourth largest city in Alabama. The City's reliance on the limited industry in the area caused the city to suffer during the recessions of 1893 and 1907. Unemployment rose and consumer purchases fell during these periods, but the recessions were short lived and each time the City rebounded with greater productiv-

ity and increased employment.

The mining and steel-

The recession of 1907 left the area's largest corporation, the Tennessee Coal, Iron, and Railroad Company, saddled with a \$5 million debt, which it was forced to alleviate through a stock sell to United States Steel. When the USS Company took over the steel operations of the TCI plant, company officials committed USS resources to the development of the Bessemer area. The TCI subsidiary of USS established a welfare program for sick and injured workers (including the formation of a medical clinic headed by Dr. Lloyd Noland, a physician instrumental in discovering the cause of the Yellow Fever virus which plagued Panama Canal workers), constructed houses for workers (many of which are still standing), planned and paved roads, installed drainage

and sewage systems, and built playgrounds and recreational areas. They even established their own school system, which won national praise for academic excellence (a salary subsidy from USS enabled the school system to successfully recruit college-educated teachers).

The Simmons family began their business in Bessemer around the time the city was established in 1887, according to Betty Simmons. Simmons family businesses have been on the corner of Second Avenue and 20th Street for four generations, beginning with PN Simmons, Ralph Simmons' father, who was co-owner of "Simmons and Buck" a dry goods and grocery store.

In the early 1900's, the Simmons family ran a clothing store on 20th street. In the 1940's, Ralph and Sam Simmons (cousins) opened Simmons Pawn Shop on the corner of Second Avenue and 20th Street. Upon his return from WWII in 1945, Ralph continued to purchase merchandise and increase the inventory of the business. Ralph Simmons purchased Sam's interest in the pawn shop in 1951 and became the sole owner of the business. Ralph and Betty Simmons continued to grow the business over the next 30 years. Since Ralph was an avid continued to be a mainstay in Bessemer's economy. Simmons Sport

fisherman and bird hunter, he began to sell fishing and hunting supplies within the pawn shop. Ralph and Betty had five children who all grew up in the business. In 1972, the name was officially changed to Simmons Sporting Goods and the pawn shop days were over. In 1982, Ralph Sr. retired and handed over the reins to his remain-

ing sons, Clay, Barry, and Peter. After Barry's untimely death in 2006, Clay and Peter continued to run the family business.


Today, Simmons Sporting Goods continues the tradition of a "family business" with two generations of the Simmons Family working


#### 43. Herman F. Lehman III
