## The Bessemer Area Chamber of Commerce Kicks off Centennial Celebration

The Bessemer Chamber will celebrate 100 years of service to the business community and the city of Bessemer in 2022 and plans to celebrate this momentous occasion during the entire year! To kick off the centennial celebration, the chamber will host its 100<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting on Thursday, February 3<sup>rd</sup> at 12pm at the Bessemer Civic Center. This year's guest speaker for the 100<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting will be Paige G. Hutto IOM, the president and CEO of the Chamber of Commerce Association of Alabama.

The Annual Meetings are held at the beginning of the year to set the tone for the upcoming year. The chamber's outgoing chairman of the board, Carlton Jackson (Bessemer Fire Department) will review the previous year under his leadership, followed by the incoming chairman's

introduction and an overview of the chamber's mission and plans for the year ahead. Mitch Avery (Spire) will serve as the chairman of the board for the duration of the chamber's centennial year. We are looking forward to the events planned for the year! A special centennial edition of the Bessemer Magazine, the area's only magazine, will be distributed during the meeting. This magazine will feature articles highlighting the chamber's 100 years of service, as well as a glimpse of the chamber and the city of Bessemer's future.



The chamber will be awarding the prestigious Charles A. Long Sr. Outstanding Civic Award to a deserving recipient who has served the community in the tradition of its namesake, Mr. Long. Charles A. Long was a devoted business and civic leader whose inspiration and guidance were of tremendous influence during and after his long years of leadership and service to Bessemer. Any living man or woman who has provided leadership and service to the business and civic interests of Bessemer is eligible for nomination! After awarding the 57<sup>th</sup> recipient, the Bessemer Chamber plans to retire the Charles A. Long, Sr. Outstanding Civic Award. To nominate a worthy candidate, the nominator must complete the nomination form. Past recipients are not eligible for

One church is giving back to the Marvel City in a super way. New Life Interfaith Ministries Inc. hosted its annual 'Christmas in the Marvel City' Saturday December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021, spreading holiday cheer to families in Bessemer. "It is amazing. A blessing that's number one, just outstanding," said one Bessemer resident. "They give back to the people and they want to see our community grow." Superheroes of the Marvel City took to the streets to give families a Merry Christmas, especially with the pandemic impacting families. "It's been a tough year," Organizer George Matthews III



said. "We wanted to make sure we gave the community something to latch onto as far as hope goes."

New Life Interfaith Ministries hoped to do just that by bringing back its annual 'Christmas in the City'. "This year we just decided to do it on a large scale and make sure we take care of the entire city," Matthews said. Volunteers dressed as Marvel characters passed out \$10,000 worth of Christmas gifts to families. "Previous years, we probably looked to serve 200 to 300 children. This year we're looking to impact 1,000 families," he added. Each child received a goodie bag

filled with sweets, a \$25 gift card and if they were lucky enough, an even bigger prize. "I got a golden ticket and I got a LOL thing," said Heaven Wilder from Bessemer. Wilder's siblings didn't get a golden ticket but that's the least of their worries. "It's not about the presents, it's about family," said Wilder's brother Zayden. To supply all their holiday needs, the church passed out 300 complimentary food boxes for families to have groceries this Christmas. This was the biggest year yet for the church surpassing their \$25,000 goal to host this event. Matthews said everyone at the church, sponsors and community members chipped in to make it happen.

## **Bessemer Chamber Partners With Homefront Housing**

Every year the Bessemer Area Chamber of Commerce partners with the Homefront Housing as they host their annual Soldier Tree Toy Program which provides Christmas gifts and books to the children of active-duty service members and veterans who have served in the armed forces. 
